

Course Specifications and Build Information

Please use the information below as a reference to gain an understanding of the course specifications for each discipline. Freestyle BC and the LOC will work with your Operations and Terrain Park staff to ensure terrain/feature specifications are acceptable while working with conditions, terrain size, budgets etc.

Terrain Guidelines - Slopestyle

Freestyle BC Slopestyle Guidelines "Best Practice"

We value creativity, and a passionate Park Crew and appreciate that all resorts have strict operating budgets, schedules and resources that dictate what is possible and when. We also have a requirement to provide safe and skill-level appropriate facilities to our athletes during these competitions.

As the Host-Resort, this is your time to shine! Creating well-built, memorable courses that showcase your skills as a Terrain Park Crew! In order to avoid last-minute changes and requests we encourage the Host-Resort, Terrain Park Manager and the local Freestyle Club to communicate before the start of the season to design a feasible course that is safe and fun and that can be used by the public throughout the season.

What to Build?

All events are expected to provide a course accessible to a wide range of skier abilities for Timber Tour and Shred Series Slopestyle events. To do this, course builders should focus on designing a minimum of 2 lanes for each competition (ie. 2 lane options for Shred Series and 2 lane options for Timber Tour).

- All jump platforms should have side-car options.
- All courses should have a minimum of 5 features (eg. box, rail, jump, jump, jump)

Timber Tour (L2T, T2T). Ages U14 - 18+ (majority of athletes will be U14 and U16)

One lane is to be designed for the top-tier athletes (Train to Train stage). This would include jumps of 35' – 50' and "L" and "XL" labelled rails. The other lane should include jumps 10' – 20' with "S" or "M" box and rail features. The 'smaller' lane MUST include some "ride on" features so any athlete new to the Timber Tour level can feel comfortable participating in the competition.

Shred Series (Fundamentalz, L2T). Ages U8 - U16

The Shred Series is our youngest age category and consists primarily of beginner skiers new to the competitive environment. Courses should be consistent with your beginner park (eg. 5'-10' jumps, boxes, PVC and beginner rail features). All sliding features should be built as "ride-on".

The Freestyle Canada Terrain Guidelines

These guidelines can help determine appropriate features and sizes for all skill levels and LTAD stages.

Upper Corral - Corral areas must allow for athletes to gather and stage prior to their runs. Preferably a flat area that is out of the way of the public with a vantage point for participants to watch other competitors' runs.

Finish Area - As athletes exit the course, collisions with the public must be prevented. This may be achieved by way of a finish corral or by way of providing an exit on the opposite side of the course from where the public is permitted to ski. A high visibility physical barrier MUST separate the public from the course to mitigate the risk of collision.
